Traditional Bluegrass and Old-Time Gospel Song; **DATE:** Early 1900's; **CATEGORY:** Early Bluegrass Gospel; **RECORDING INFO:** Mississippi John Hurt; **OTHER NAMES:** When My Blood Runs Chilly and Cold; Glory Land March; **NOTES:** One of the earliest popular praise choruses (one part song), the tune is based loosely on Battle Hymn of The Republic. Do Lord emerged in part in the 1920's and became popular at church meetings.
