**Intro:** G D / E<sub>m</sub> C / G D C x2 (Key of G)

G D Headed down south to the land of the pines

E<sub>m</sub> C And I'm thumbin' my way into North Carolina

G D C Starin' up the road, and pray to God I see headlights

G D I made it down the coast in seventeen hours

E<sub>m</sub> C Pickin' me a bouquet of dogwood flowers

G D C And I'm hopin' for Raleigh, I can see my baby tonight...

## Chorus:

G D So rock me, mama. Like a wagon wheel

E<sub>m</sub> C Rock me, mama, anyway you feel

G D C Hey, mama rock me

G D Rock me, mama, like the wind and the rain

E<sub>m</sub> C Rock me, mama, like a south-bound train

G D C Hey, mama rock me

**Break** G D / E<sub>m</sub> C / G D C x2

G D Runnin' from the cold up in New England

E<sub>m</sub> C I was born to be a fiddler in an old-time string-band

G D C My baby plays the guitar, I pick a banjo now

G D Oh, the north country winters keep a gettin' me now

E<sub>m</sub> C Lost my money playin' poker so I had to up and leave

G D C But I ain't a turnin' back to livin' that old life no more

G D Walkin' to the south out of Roanoke

E<sub>m</sub> C I caught a trucker out of Philly, had a nice long toke

G D C But he's headed west from the Cumberland Gap to Johnson City, Tennessee
